If you would like to be in the know about what's happening right now in the world of contemporary music, the Lucerne Festival Academy is the place to be. For four weeks, you get to focus entirely on contemporary music and work with some of today's leading performers. Being part of the public community is a new pillar of the Academy, which will be expanded from 2026 onwards. New and existing formats will be implemented in collaboration with guerillaclassics. Beginning in 2026, the Academy will be led by composer, clarinetist, and conductor Jörg Widmann, with whom you will tackle such projects as Wolfgang Rihm's Tutuguri, a spectacular exploration of sound which will also be performed on tour at the Philharmonie Berlin and the Isarphilharmonie Munich. You will also meet Mark Andre, the 2026 Summer Festival's composer-in-residence, and work on his clarinet concerto *über* as well as his large-scale orchestral triptych *Im Entschwinden – Im Entfalten –* Im Entbergen. The lineup additionally includes world premieres by Jalalu-Kalvert Nelson and Liza Lim, who has written a concerto for the carnyx, an ancient bronze trumpet. And in keeping with the Summer Festival's theme of "American Dreams," the program spans music from John Adams and Steve Reich to Frank Zappa and his legendary final work, The Yellow Shark.

But the Lucerne Festival Academy extends well beyond instrumental training: young conductors can apply for the Contemporary-Conducting Program, while Dieter Ammann and Unsuk Chin offer a one-week Composer Seminar.

Founded in 2004 by Pierre Boulez and later led by Wolfgang Rihm, the Lucerne Festival Academy gives young musicians from around the world the opportunity to engage deeply with the music of our time — from 20th- and 21st-century classics to freshly written scores. Leading performers of contemporary music serve as coaches and offer indepth workshops. The Lucerne Festival Academy Coaches, who are former Academy members, will also be on hand as mentors during rehearsals to pass on their experience. All participants of the Academy play in the Lucerne Festival Contemporary Orchestra (LFCO) and additionally join together in various ensembles to perform events as part of the Festival's related programming.
